We hope this letter finds you well. As is typically the case at this time of year, Autumn brings with it numerous updates and developments in and around our office... Please take the time to review this newsletter carefully!

FLU SHOTS ARE COMING...

As our patients know, we strongly recommend getting a flu shot EVERY year. While **we do not yet have flu shots** in our office, the first shipments of flu shots are expected to go out to primary care clinics in the coming weeks.

Once we do receive them, rest assured that we will begin administering shots in our office, and will communicate plans for our regular Flu Shot Clinics. Our expectation is that **our Flu Shot Clinics will likely occur in late Oct/early Nov**, as we have typically done in the past. In the interim, flu shots will eventually also be widely available at many pharmacies.

If you do receive a flu shot somewhere other than our office, we strongly encourage you to let us know so we can update your chart accordingly!

COVID UPDATES

We continue to encourage our patients to ensure that they are adequately protected against COVID-19.



All Ontarians 18 and older are now eligible for the **Bivalent booster shot**, which specifically targets the Omicron variant of COVID-19 that has been circulating more recently. Booster shots are recommended at least 6 months after a previous vaccine dose or COVID infection, although 3 months (84 days) may be considered based on age, risk and health status. If getting a booster dose after a recent COVID infection, 6 months (168 days) may provide a better immune response.

Pfizer and Moderna shots are now available for **children aged 6 months to 5 years** as well. Appointments can be booked through the <u>Ontario vaccination portal</u>; likewise, vaccination is available at community locations throughout the city, such as the North York Family Health Team's Family Friendly COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics (Tuesdays in October, 240 Duncan Mill Rd, #803: <u>www.nyfht.com</u>).

OCEAN - ONLINE ENGAGEMENT

As mentioned in our July newsletter, our office has begun using the Ocean Patient Engagement Platform, and will continue to roll out its use in the coming weeks and months. Please note that you may start to receive new and different forms of online correspondence from our office, including:

- Secure email messages
- Appointment reminders
- Intake forms
- Clinical forms & screening tools to be completed in advance of appointments, and automatically uploaded directly to your chart upon completion
- eReferrals

We will also be introducing the option to book certain appointment types online, via Ocean's Online Appointment Booking (OAB) system.
